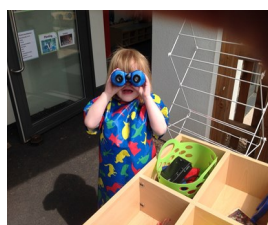

Absence from School

Can I please reiterate my plea not to take holidays in

term time? As a school we have attendance which averages at 95%. National average is 96%. This means in real terms that so far this year Chaddesley Pupils have lost 270 days more schooling than National Average. Ofsted take attendance into account when grading schools and at the moment our attendance is definitely requiring improvement. Absence from school harms children's progress and disrupts also the learning of others as the teacher is playing catch up with the absent child. Please schedule holidays for the 13 weeks that school is closed each year.
