Speech, Language & Communication Skills Newsletter Tips

Speech, language and communication skills are important for all children, not just those with identified needs. This fun activity will heighten your awareness of speaking & listening and in turn develop language skills that are so important to literacy & learning.

Write down on pieces of paper a range of words.

They might be related to what your child is learning in school or any words that they are familiar with. Place all the words in a 'hat'. Each person takes a turn at taking out words from the hat. The challenge is to describe the word without using it at all. For instance: for 'Africa' you can say it is a continent, it is much hotter than UK and you would find the river Nile there. Remember you can't say 'Africa' in the clue though.
