
Please feel free to drop-in during the above times to discuss any concerns you have about your child's educational needs.



Household Support Fund



In partnership with the **Department for Work and Pensions** (DWP) the **Household Support Fund** (HSF) grant will help households in Worcestershire who are most in need for support with energy bills, food and water bills. The scheme will run between 1 October 2022 to 31 March 2023.

The Household Support Fund

The Household Support Fund (HSF) will provide support to those most in need (including families with children of all ages, pensioners, unpaid carers, care leavers, and people with disabilities) by providing vouchers or payments to eligible households or making direct provisions to help with food and goods.

How can I apply for the household support fund to help with energy?
