Hello



Goodbye

'Hello' and 'Goodbye' are a simple wave, as in natural gesture. These signs are important for developing social skills and building relationships. Some children get confused about whether a person is coming or going, particularly if yours is a busy household. If this is the case, it may help to distinguish 'Hello' as above with a single movement, and 'Goodbye' with a repeated movement.



VOLUNTEERS NEEDED



The NSPCC is calling on people across the Midlands to help keep children safe by teaching primary school pupils how to recognise signs of abuse and the importance of speaking to trusted adults about their worries.



The charity's schools service runs a programme in primary schools called Speak out Stay safe that includes face-to-face workshops in which children are taught to understand that they have a right to feel safe, and that they can speak to a trusted adult or Childline if they ever need help or support.

However, due to a shortage of volunteers, the charity is struggling to provide face-to-face workshops in all areas.

We need new volunteers from the Midlands to help us protect the next generation of children from abuse and neglect.
