Maths Challenge

On 4th May, 4 Year 5 pupils attended a maths challenge competition at Cookely Primary School competing against 4 local Primary Schools. It was a great atmosphere and they all worked really hard on some challenging mathematics! Their behaviour and manners were impeccable.



<u>Tri Golf Festival</u> 10 Year 3 pupils had a fantastic morning of golf this week. They competed against 15 other schools in 8 different games. Each game provided a different challenge where children needed to master a variety of skills. These included, chipping, putting and driving.
