had a great time and shared their favourite memories of the day with their friends and teachers.



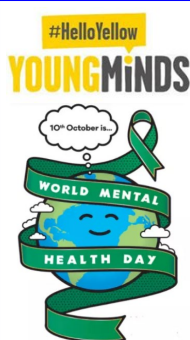
This half term, the Kiddermminster Harriers Football Club have been coming into

The children at Chaddesley Corbett Endowed Primary School had a wonderful time on World Mental Health Day on 10th October as they explored a range of activities planned for and prepared by the well-being ministers from each year group. The activities were designed to promote positive mental health, self-regulation and most importantly to 'get talking'. The activities included; sensory play and exploration using homemade playdough and orbeez, mindfulness colouring, fidget toys, yoga, a colourful reading den and a range of resources for proprioception which means 'our body's ability to sense movement, action, and location'.

Many of these activities are featured in the ARC as part of a sensory integrated environment. Our 'get talking' tea and cake afternoon was very busy with barely a crumb left; thank you! We raised a fabulous £136.20 to donate to the Young Minds, children's mental health charity.

Here are some examples of children enjoying mindfulness colouring, using fidget toys and using movement to support sensory regulation. (Proprioception, otherwise known as kinesthesia, is your body's ability to sense movement, action, and location).

They did really well and used a lot of the skills taught in their PE lessons to help them. They were very well behaved and thoroughly enjoyed the morning.
