## Year 5 & 6 Workshop about Bullying & Hate Crimes

A dedicated Police Community Officer recently engaged our Year 5 and 6 students in meaningful discussions about bullying and hate crimes. Through interactive activities, they explored how we may judge people based on their looks. Children picked teams using pictures, and they had to use looks as their only way of choosing an effective team. This was an impactful starter and opened children's eyes to how easy it can be to categorise and stereotype people.

Further discussions showed the impact of bullying and hate crime. They also discussed unkindness online. This experience enhanced their understanding of ideas we discuss in our curriculum. It highlighted the importance of kindness and fostering a safer and more inclusive environment.
