Consultation on the proposed development of a mainstream autism base at Chaddesley Corbett Endowed Primary School

Dear Sir/Madam

The Governors of Chaddesley Corbett Endowed Primary School are seeking your views about the proposal to construct and operate a ten-pupil mainstream autism base. This will enable the school to build on its success as a wholly inclusive school, grow the SEND skills and resources within the school and better meet the needs and secure the futures of vulnerable pupils.

Our rural school's open spaces and modern design offer an ideal setting for creating a successful centre of excellence for primary pupils with a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder.

This change is being considered for January 2022. Anyone with an interest in this change is very welcome to provide their response. We are holding an informal virtual drop-in consultation on Tuesday 20th April at 6pm where there will be an opportunity to see a presentation by our Headteacher, Emma James, to ask questions and discuss the reasons for this proposal.
