KS1 Homework Expectations


All KS1 children are expected to:

• Parents are required to sign, initial, or date their child's reading diary **3 times a week.**

As a parent, if you want to write comments about your child's reading in the reading record that is fine but is not essential. The reading diary will serve as a log of the books children have read and accessed at home or in school.

KS2 Homework Expectations



All KS2 children are expected to:

- Read three or more times a week,
- Practise their times tables using TTRS three times a week,
- Complete a brief activity or answer a question based on the KIRF (Key Instant Recall Fact) each week.

Only Year 5 and 6 children need to complete their weekly KIRF task/activity in homework books.

All homework will be set on a **Thursday**. Year 5 and 6 children will have to hand in their completed KIRF task the following Tuesday; this will be marked together as a class.

If you want to complete more homework with your child, please look at your child's class page to find the <u>topic homework grid</u> and useful <u>spellings</u>. Your child can also use <u>Rollama</u> to develop their SPaG skills. This is not compulsory!
