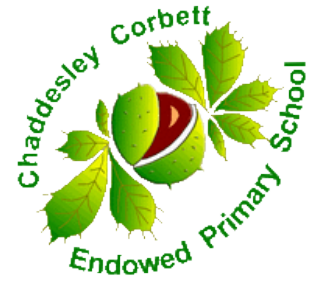




Key Instant Recall Facts

Y1– Autumn 2



I can recall the number bonds up to and including ten.

Number bonds	Key Vocabulary
<p>Children should be confident in identifying number bonds within 10: e.g. Number bonds to 6</p>  <p> $5 + 1 = 6$ $4 + 2 = 6$ $3 + 3 = 6$ $2 + 4 = 6$ $1 + 5 = 6$ </p> <p>Children should be able to recall and represent all number bonds to 10: e.g.</p> 	<p>5 add 3 equals 8</p> <p>2 more than 4 = 6</p> <p>7 and 3 make 10</p> <p>If 3 is a part and 2 is a part, then 5 is the whole</p>

Take it further:

Use addition facts to record related subtraction facts. E.g. If 5 add 3 equals 8 then 8 subtract 5 equals 3.

Spot patterns within and between numbers.

Missing number problems e.g. $4 + \underline{\quad} = 7$

Spot and explain mistakes.

Top Tips

The secret to successfully embedding knowledge is practising it **little** and **often**. Regularly return to the skills and incorporate into simple games and other activities.
